


Take the JR Keiyo Line to Shinkiba Station. Change there to the Rinkai Line. About 20 minutes.

The Weather

Having a unique location north of the equator in the Asian Pacific Ocean, Japan enjoys all 4 seasons. With beautiful cherry blossoms in the spring, tropical summers, autumns rich with breathtaking foliage, and frosty winters, Japan offers virtually all of the world's climates in one place!

July is the height of summer, with schools on vacation, sunny days and high temperatures. Humidity is plenty high so make sure to pack plenty of light clothes and caps!

Currency

Japan uses the Yen as its currency, and both coins and bills are equally used. Coins come in denominations of ¥1, ¥5, ¥10, ¥50, ¥100 and ¥500, and with bills being ¥1,000, ¥2,000 (although extremely rare!), ¥5,000 and ¥10,000.

You can exchange foreign currencies at the airport or your hotel, but just remember to be careful when spending your coins! The ¥500 is equal to almost US \$5, and you can end up spending a lot of money before you know what happened!

Most shops automatically add the 8% sales tax to prices, so you won't have to do much counting. If you happen to go to a restaurant, remember, there is absolutely NO TIPPING!



Communication and Electricity

Public payphones (usually bright green) are still quite common in Japan and most are capable of making international calls if you're in a pinch! Payphones here accept coins and calling cards.

Japan is quickly catching up with the world and the number of places with Free Wi-Fi is rapidly increasing. If you ever need Wi-Fi on the go, it's helpful to remember that every 7-11 convenience store in the country has Free Wi-Fi!



Electricity

Japanese outlets are 120V of electricity and feature the same type of plugs as 2 pronged American plugs (Type A).

A Few Guidelines

While Japan is one of the safest countries in the world, it is always wise to be mindful of yourself and your belongings. The people here love peace an tranquility, so in general, don't use a loud voice in crowded public situations like in the subway or on trains. The following are a few things to keep in mind when coming here:

If you're bringing any kind of medication, please make sure your medicine is legal in Japan. Laws here regarding medicine are much stricter than many other countries and you may face legal trouble if bringing in the wrong kind!
